MESSAGE FROM DOUG BROOKS, CHAIR OF THE BOARD AND CAROLYN ACKER, INTERIM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

2017 was a very exciting and challenging year at For Youth Initiative (FYI) as we continued to implement our 2016-2019 Strategic Plan and improve our programs. At the same time, we had to balance the challenges of doing continuous fundraising for operations in order to be able to serve the youth of York South-Weston (YSW) effectively.

At FYI we provide individualized, wrap-around support to youth in the life transitions they encounter as they prepare for adulthood. Our priority is to focus on serving youth in York South-Weston in order to help them graduate high school and move on to post-secondary education or employment. We also maintain a broader role in advocating for our youth and community across the city and province.

In 2017 we increased the capacity of our program supports and we also increased our community partnerships, expanded our revenue sources, deepened academic and employment support partnerships and incubated over 20 youth initiatives and ventures focused on YSW.

Over the year we served more than 500 youth and supported 85 youth in conflict with the law. As you read this Annual Report you will be able to see the accomplishments and outcomes achieved in our Youth Ambassadors Program, Youth in Transition to Post Secondary Education Program, Youth in Transition to Employment Program, Youth Outreach Program, Youth Justice Program and our Youth Incubator. We continue to work with youth, parents, educators, funders, and community partners to broaden our impact. Our plans for 2018 include developing and refining our indicators and outcome measures in order to better define the outcomes our students are achieving and ensure FYI's accountability to the community.

FYI is excited about what's to come as we've established a strong foundation to grow our capacity to serve the diverse needs of youth in our community. We look forward to inviting you as a valued member of the FYI family to contribute your time and talents to support us in unlocking the potential of teens and young adults with the mentorship, tools and support they need to thrive.

2017 OUTCOME HIGHLIGHTS:

- FYI served 546 unique youth
- 60 youth volunteered 1,920 hours in their community
- 68 youth attained employment
- 55 youth transitioned into post-secondary
- 29 are on track to post-secondary
- 83 youth are on track to graduate high school
- 108 youth are on track to attain employment
- 31 youth involved in the criminal justice system
 re-enrolled in school
- 53 youth had their charges withdrawn
- FYI reached out to 120 new youth
- FYI's Youth Incubator Program incubated 20 youth-led initiatives

A SPACE TO CALL THEIR OWN

Our community centre is open for youth to drop in and access on-site resources Monday through Friday. These include a computer lab, a quiet space for homework and free on-site tutoring, an arts and crafts room equipped with sewing machines, as well as a recording studio. Youth can also unwind and interact with staff in the FYI Lounge where nutritious meals are prepared and shared together.


THE FYI MODEL

Every young person's journey is unique and their needs are too. FYI provides programs and services that meet youth where they are and support them in getting to where they want to be.

A young person's first step at For Youth Initiative is to meet with a Case Lead. During the intake process, the Case Lead will perform a needs assessment and discuss their individual goals. The Case Lead will recommend programs and resources at FYI and external partner organizations that could support the individual in their journey. The youth and Case Lead will regularly connect to check-in and track developments. Case Leads act as mentors, aides, and allies to the youth at FYI.

Our programs are designed to empower a young person to identify and reach their personal goals, graduate high school, enroll in postsecondary education, gain employment and achieve independence. To reach these milestones we provide support in four areas: mentorship, skills development, support network development, and financial assistance. Youth ages 12 to 29 can enroll whether they are in or out of school, working or not.

OUR PROGRAMS

YOUTH AMBASSADORS

Designed for high school-aged youth, Youth Ambassadors aspires to support participants by offering tailored academic planning and tutoring support to achieve goals, graduate high school and provide the foundation for future success.

Participants attend weekly leadership development sessions and work collectively with their peers to lead community projects that create the positive change they wish to see in their neighborhoods. Through these initiatives youth can grow their peer support network, gain experience accomplishing goals as a team and give back to their community. In addition to community projects, this dynamic program includes on-site and off-site events such as personal development workshops, group discussions and recreational activities. This popular program hosts hundreds of youth each year.

OUR PROGRAMS

YOUTH JUSTICE

The Youth Justice program serves youth ages 12 to 29 who are in conflict with the law to provide them with holistic life supports. With specialized focus on Prevention and Intervention, Youth Justice also serves youth who are atrisk of criminal involvement. The program focuses on four crucial areas: educational attainment, family well being, employment & career, and social engagement. Case Leads work closely with participants to identify goals and track ongoing progress. The program is rooted in Restorative Justice, fostering accountability among participants and endeavoring to bring peace and repair to the community. Participants are provided with opportunities to connect with mentors, develop their social skills and unpack topics such as bullying, anger management and effective decision-making. Youth can also fulfill their obligations to meet extrajudicial sanctions and Community Service Orders through the program. Case Managers work closely with participants' lawyers and probation officers to provide strong supports for youth in court. As the majority of youth are underage, parental involvement and engagement in the program is vital.

"I am happy I got referred to FYI. Being a part of the Youth Justice Program with Elder Shaikh helped me a lot — Elder has been like a dad to me. He's helped me improve my health, at home with my family, and he's helped me navigate the court and justice systems and to find a job. Knowing I had the support from Elder made me feel more determined to help improve myself because I wasn't alone in facing those challenges. I recommend all young people to get engaged with FYI for homework and academic support, and when looking for a job. Go before getting yourself in trouble and you need to see the Youth Justice team."

OUR PROGRAMS

YOUTH IN TRANSITION

Youth in Transition serves teenagers and young adults up to age 29 as they make important decisions that will shape their adult lives. The program focuses on educational attainment, training and employment to equip participants with resources, expose them to new opportunities and support them in reaching their full potential. Program facilitators work closely with participants to identify individual needs, goals and interests. Weekly group events include skill development workshops, career speaker series and off-site visits to college, university and career fairs. Participants are connected to youth employment specialists, and can receive assistance with applications for education, training and grants.



"Through FYI's Post-Secondary Department I obtained lots of information and advice in regards to how I should choose my school, how to find out what path I want to take and what I should do once I get there. As part of the program we had the chance to visit the University of Toronto's St. George Campus and got a peak into what life is like as a university student. This tour helped me put myself in the shoes of a university student as well as to make my final decision for university applications. Now, I am proud to say that I have been accepted at the University of Toronto's Psychology Life Sciences program and will become one of the very students I met during our tour. I will continue to receive support from those in the Post-Secondary Department as I make my way through this new chapter in life and continue to be very appreciative and thankful for their guidance."

YOUTH INCUBATOR

The Youth Incubator is designed to help young entrepreneurs aged 16 to 29 to grow their community initiatives and business ventures. Participants will be equipped with knowledge and skills through workshops led by seasoned industry professionals who are experts on essential organizational development topics such as program design, grant writing, team management, branding, and financial management. Through regular networking events participants can connect and learn from one another, building their personal and professional networks. FYI's Youth Incubator supports young entrepreneurs who are creating solutions that will create positive change and lasting impact for themselves and their communities.

OUR PROGRAMS

YOUTH OUTREACH WORKER

Youth Outreach Worker (YOW) Program is designed to serve youth aged 12-29 and their families, who are at risk of, or engaging in, antisocial, criminal and/or risky behavior, face multiple barriers to success, are disengaged from their communities, reside in an identified priority neighborhood and/or belong to a distinct population. The YOW program helps bridge the gap between youth/ community and service providers/community resources by providing information to youth. The focus of the YOW program is to connect youth with their needed supports and services. These connections happen through needs assessments, 1-on-1s, follow ups and workshops. The YOW program reaches youth in schools, community, libraries, community centres, and restaurants.
